Format of Play: Individual Stroke Play + TEAM Scramble

18 Hole Players 9 Hole Players

Fees: \$30/18 Holes \$20/9 Holes

Tees: Refer to Tee Sheet for Tee Assignments,
Starting Holes & Starting Times

Caddies/Carts: NO CADDIES - NO CADDIE CARTS
*** Exception: Players starting from Yellow
or Red Fairway Stakes - bags ride.....players walk.

Rules for Spectators

- ** Carts permitted – use cart paths
Cart Fees: 18 Holes/\$15 9 Holes/\$10
- ** Assist players off course due to inclement weather.
- ** May not come within 30 yards of players during the course of play.

Dress Code: Players & Spectators - Shirt with collar....or sleeveless shirt with short sleeves.
No TANK TOPS.....NO Athletic Shorts

Bags: Players may carry bag or use push cart.
*Note: Spectator Cars encouraged to assist with evacuation due to weather.
ALL Players may ride Spectator Carts/Official Carts between green & next tee.*

Official Carts: Official Carts monitor play, assist players and advise on Rules for Spectators.
Spectator Carts can help FILL SAND DIVOTS + RAKE BUNKERS / Keep Play Moving

Maximum Score: When players reach a score on any hole equal to double par.....pick up ball and record score of double par + 1.

Balls Lost: Balls lost or Out of Bounds.....add two strokes drop ball in fairway.

Reduced Round: Scores - relationship to PAR (+/-) for # of holes played by all players in each group

Scorecards: Players return signed/attested scorecards AT THE SCOREBOARD

Ties: Over-All Championship Awards: Sudden Victory Play-Off. If tied after first hole then a Chip-Off. All other positions shall stand (no play-offs)

Rules of Play: Refer to Orchid Island Golf Club Local Rules Sheet

Players Club Rules: All tournament policies in AJGT shall apply for players and spectators.

2019 Local Rules

1. **SUSPENSION OF PLAY FOR DANGEROUS REASONS:** *Our Lightning detection system will go off with one long blast of the siren if a dangerous system is approaching. All players must discontinue play and seek shelter. Shelters are located on holes #4 and #12.*
2. **OUT OF BOUNDS** will be **defined by white stakes**, boundary fences (holes 6, 7, 8 & 13), and the interior portion of any roadway. Any ball coming to rest left of the left side of the cart path on hole 4,5 & 10 is out of bounds. Any ball coming to rest on the opposite side of the cart path behind the 17th green will be deemed out of bounds. Out of bounds is defined by white stakes. A ball coming to rest on or over a road, (even if the ball comes to rest on another part of the course), is out of bounds. When lateral water hazards are bounded by out of bounds, the hazard margin coincides with the out of bounds line. (This occurs with the lateral hazard on holes 1,2,3,4,7,8,10,14,15, 16,17 &18. It is marked by a red stake and white stake together). Any ball coming to rest on the non-golf course side of a water hazard is deemed out of bounds.
- 4 **OBSTRUCTIONS:** Paved cart paths are obstructions.
Relief from staked trees is from stake only not tree.
5. **LATERAL WATER HAZARD:** Defined by red stakes and designated by red lines. The lines are in the hazard.
In the absence of stakes or Red painted lines.....hazard is defined by waters edge.
6. **HOLE MADE BY BURROWING ANIMAL** - entitled to relief, except in a water hazard, from a hole cast by a burrowing animal, reptile, or bird. Locate the nearest point of relief, no nearer the hole, and drop within one club length. This includes ants and moles.
7. **BALL DROP** Any ball entering the lateral water hazards on holes 8, 12 & 16 may use the designated BALL DROP AREA.
8. **BUNKERS (hazards):** A “bunker” is a hazard consisting of a prepared (maintained regularly) area of ground, often a hollow, from which turf or soil has been removed and replaced with sand or the like.
9. **SANDY AREAS (through the green):** Sandy areas, all of which include either spartina grass, oak trees and palm trees growing within them and are not maintained regularly and do not have a rake provided are considered through the green. You may ground your club in these areas.
10. **LIFTING AN EMBEDDED BALL:** "Through the green", a ball which is embedded in its own pitch-mark in the ground, other than sand, may be lifted without penalty, cleaned and dropped .
11. **GROUND UNDER REPAIR INCLUDES:** Rule 25-1
 - a. Areas defined by white lines
 - b. Maintained flower beds
 - c. Fire ant mounds
 - d. Material piled for removal and a hole made by a green keeper, even if not so marked
12. ***Dangerous Situations: Stay away from water hazards due to alligators & snakes.***

SPECIAL LOCAL RULE

If your ball lies on the putting surface and you do not have a direct line to the cup you may take a free drop off of the putting surface no nearer the hole. You may not chip off of the putting surface.
